## Introduction

This is a compendium of Hans von Schweinitz Self-Improvement education. “Self-Improvement Education in the military means any course taken that is not part of your career field and is provided by a non-military education institution.

Hans was born into an estate (Alt Raudten) on 26 October 1934. He was the first-born son and was destined to inherit the estate. Therefor Hans was to be educated so that he would be able to manage the estate.

This education should have been done mostly through private tutors. Hans was to start his schooling in 1940, his sixth year, but he suffered from a burst appendix. In 1940, this was a serious medical condition and because there was no penicillin yet, the recovery was lengthy. Hans did not start his schooling until 1941. The estate was in financial difficulty and there was no money for tutors, so Hans went to the local village school. This was difficult for Hans because he was the odd kid. The other kids were all village boys and already had their friendship groups, and Hans was the boy from the Manor house. Stories of Hans’ difficulties in school are included in Hans’ biography.

Some time in late 1944, the Soviet Union began winning against the German Armies. Because the Soviet Union Armies were advancing towards Germany, the estate was quickly going to be between two armies. The family left the estate near Legnica Poland and fled towards Berlin Germany about 300 Kilometers. They continued to flee and move around the countries until they could finally settle in Wiesbaden West Germany. During this time Hans education was interrupted. Hans would be entered in local schools, if possible. At one time in the 1946/47 school year, Hans was sent to a Children’s Home. By the end of the 1946/47 school year, Hans was in a school in Wiesbaden West Germany. The story about this flight (fleeing) is in another compendium about the “Flucht”.

Once settled in Wiesbaden West Germany, Hans continued his education but based on his grades and comments, Hans was in full rebellion. But eventually in March 1949 he graduated from the 8th grade Volksschule. This is the minimum schooling that is required in Germany.

In May 1950, Hans began an apprenticeship in Photography. This apprenticeship lasted 2 years and also included tutoring in other basic subjects, such as mathematics, geography, history, composition, and others. Hans apprenticeship is included in another compendium “Fotolaborant 1950-1952”. After the apprenticeship Hans worked as a photographer in Germany until March of 1957.

In March of 1957, Hans emigrated to United States. His story about emigrating is included in another compendium. Sufficient to indicated that soon after arriving in United States, Hans was drafted in the US Air Force and entered basic training in November 1957. Soon after

graduating from Basic training, Hans was assigned to a base near Madison Wisconsin. In February 1958, Hans took the United States General Educational Development (GED) High School Level test and passed. Hans passed this test written in English, less than one year after arriving in United States without the ability to read, write, or speak English. When Hans tried to take colleges courses later in 1964, the college would not accept the 1958 certificate but wanted a High School Equivalency Certificate. Hans received this certificate on 23 January 1964 from the New Mexico State Department of Education. Hans started to take college level courses towards a Bachelors.

Between 1964 and 1973, Hans would take college or university courses in order to earn a degree. Because of the nature of being in the Air Force, his progress was interrupted with temporary assignments that could last for weeks and also being assigned to another Air Base such as England, Germany, Thailand, and multiple states.

Along the way Hans often was the Dean's Honor lists. The Air Force would recognize these accomplishments.

Several times between 1964 and 1973, Hans applied for the Bootstrap program so that he may obtain his Bachelor's degree, but either was denied or his military duties interfered.

In 1973, while stationed at Maxwell AFB in Montgomery Alabama, Hans again applied for the Bootstrap program which would allow him to attend Auburn University full time in order to earn a degree. To gain entry into Auburn University in Montgomery Alabama, Hans had to collect all his transcripts. They are scanned in along with the records that the Air Force also maintained on any out-side self-improvement course.

When Hans applied for Bootstrap in 1973 he was again denied several times. Finally on 13 November 1973, the Bootstrap application was approved. In 1974 Hans attended Auburn University in Montgomery full time.

On 13 December 1974, Hans graduated from Auburn University of Montgomery with a Bachelor's of Science in Mathematics with Honor and was on the Dean's list.

In 1977, Hans had 20 years in the military and was about to retire in Austin Texas. Not sure what his retirement plans were yet, he decided to take the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) and possibly attend one of the many Universities in Austin. After retiring, Hans made other plans and never did pursue an advanced degree.

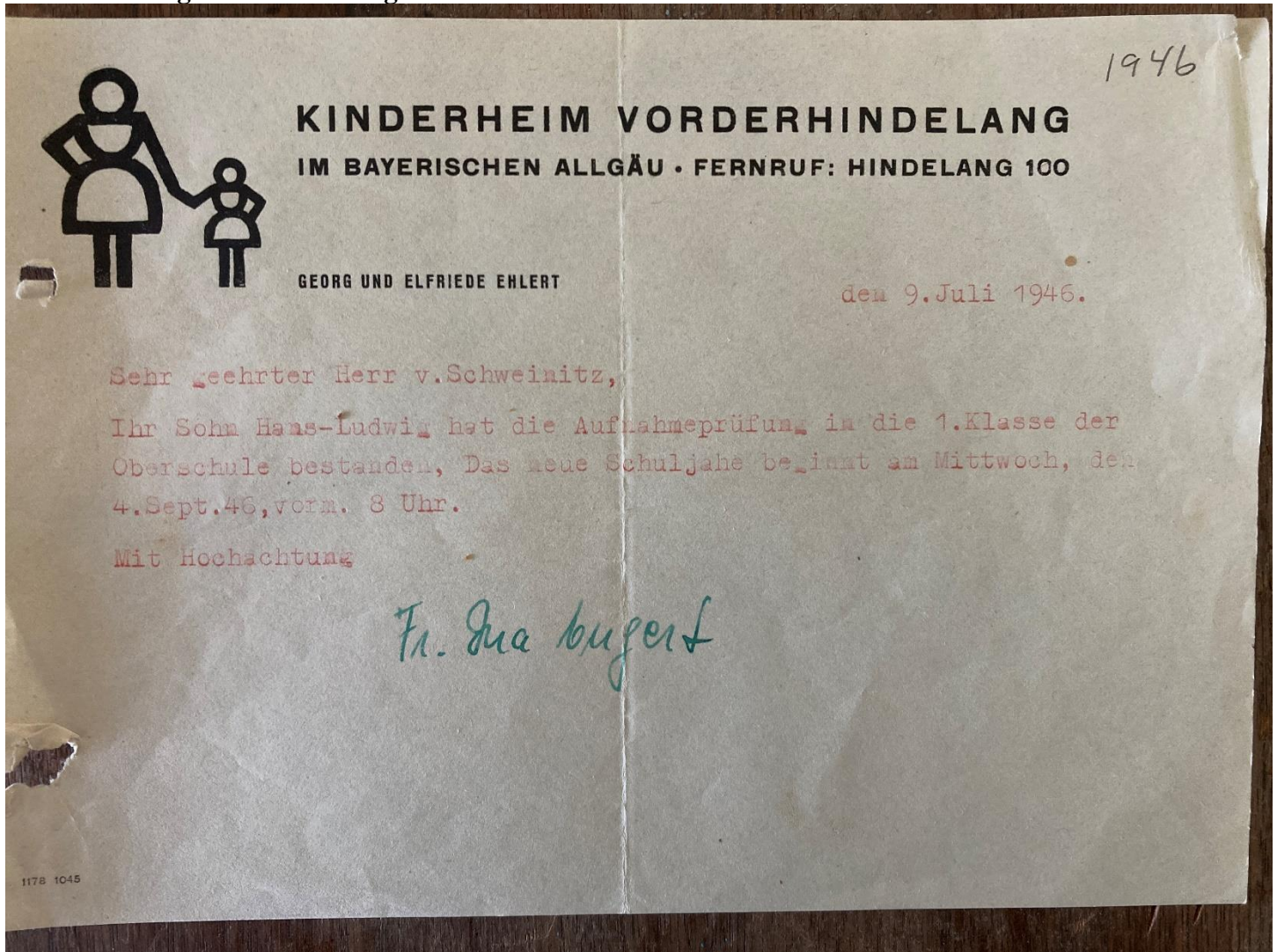

1. Request the attached Bootstrap application be reconsidered for approval.
2. In reference to the letter from Hq TAC dated 14 September 1973, I would like to furnish some additional information.

a. In January 1972, Hq TAC directed me to return to one of my additional AFSCs (23671, 63150) or voluntarily retrain into a shortage AFSC, because the 234XO AFSC field was overmanned. Selection was based on a completed SEA tour and an additional AFSC. After protest, I requested retraining into the 252X1 AFSC which was approved in February 1972. While awaiting a school date for 3ABR25231, I had my additional AFSCs (23671, 63150) withdrawn. In April 1972 my school for 3ABR252X1 and the retraining approval was cancelled because the 252X1 field had become an overage AFSC. While I attended the NCOA in May 1972, I was notified of the assignment to Dannelly ANG Base as a Technical Advisor in the 234XO field. The UDL position for the 23470 Tech Advisor will be deleted on 30 June 1974. I would be reassigned at that time. Approval of the Bootstrap would require only a 25 week delay until December 1974. In addition, approval of Bootstrap requests for enlisted personnel under 8 years or close to 20 years of service will improve retention in the 234XO field, since they would incur an additional service commitment of three times the period of TDY, to be served following the TDY. Since I have 16 years in the service and I am due to reenlist in October 1973, I can assume that the evaluator differentiates between career personnel and that I will be available for reassignment in June 1974. However, I cannot find any reference that approval of Bootstrap for personnel in my situation should fall under a different criteria.

b. To obtain a bachelor's degree a student at AUM must earn a minimum of forty-five hours in residence which must be obtained in the student's final year. The minimum load for a full-time student is 15 hours a quarter. Upper level courses in mathematics must be taken in a sequence, one each quarter, and will not be offered during off-duty hours. The Winter and Spring quarters continues the MH 320, MH 321, and MH 322 sequence which I started in September 1973. MH 460 will not be offered until Summer 1974. PS 301 will complete my minor in Physics and will be offered in the Fall of 1974 only.

c. The four lower division courses are most likely the highest level mathematics courses offered during this period which will count toward the hours required for the major. They will be replaced with 300 or 400 level courses whenever possible.

d. This is my third attempt to take advantage of the Bootstrap Program to receive a B.S. in the last three years. While stationed in England

On 28 September 1973 Hans responded with all the steps he had already followed based on advice he had been given by his commanders and Education Officers.



I was accepted by the University of Nebraska for 1970 upon return to the CONUS; however, I was sent to SEA on a consecutive overseas tour. Upon return to the CONUS in 1971 I enrolled in the University of South Carolina and was accepted for a program; however, the directed voluntary retraining cancelled this plan. Subsequent reassignment and cancellation of the retraining required me to attempt the present program at AUM. *September 1973*

e. Headquarters TAC did receive an explanation from Mrs. Robinson of the Maxwell Education Center by telephone on their objections, mentioned in paragraph l.b., and l.c. of Hq TAC letter dated 14 September 1973. The critical manning in AFSC 234XO is the main problem which is illogical due to the fact that a reduction of this AFSC was ordered in 1972, and during the past 18 months Air Force and TAC permitted many airmen in the 234XO AFSC to leave the Regular Air Force early and join the ANG under the Palace Chase Program.

f. For the last 11 years I have devoted many hours of my week-ends and evenings in the pursuit of higher education. I was ineligible for the AECF since I was not a U.S. citizen until I was above the age limit. Either age, location, citizenship, or duty commitments prevented me from career progression or from obtaining a B.S. degree. I am exploring all possible channels to reach my goal of a B.S. degree before December 1974.

ferences among various forms of each test are taken into account when the raw scores are converted to scaled scores. This makes it possible to compare the performance of students who have taken different forms of a test.

**INTERPRETING YOUR GRE SCORES**

Your GRE Aptitude Test scores have meaning only when they are compared with those of other students taking the test. Comparisons can be made using a norms table like the one found in this leaflet. The norms used for the Aptitude Test in 1975-77 are based on the scores of all students who took the Graduate Record Examinations between October 1971 and September 1974.

The relative standing of a GRE score with respect to the appropriate test group is expressed as a percentile rank—the percent of students in the group who scored lower than that scaled score. Although a given score represents approximately the same level of ability regardless of when it was earned, its relative standing (percentile rank) will vary depending on the norms group. For example, a score of 640 on the Aptitude Test (quantitative) was at the 75th percentile in 1968 and is at the 80th in 1975. You can find the relative standing of your Aptitude Test scores by looking at the norms table in this leaflet.

The normative information is also sent to institutions receiving your scores. The norms are updated every second year. Some graduate schools or fellowship organizations may prepare special norms based on their own applicants or on previously admitted students. Institutions usually use one set of current norms for comparing the scores of all applicants being evaluated in a given year regardless of when the scores were earned.
