Sheriff Smith To Return Steele Here

Sheriff W. E. Smith flew to Hickman, New Jersey, today to pick up Robert P. Steele, who is charged with the Oct. 3 shooting deaths of a Roswell woman and her 3-year-old son.

Steele, 29, an unemployed engineer, solved extradition Tuesday after his arrest at Paramus, N.J. Tuesday. He is charged with murder in the deaths of Mrs. Erika McGowan and her son, Peter Fortin.

Walker Air Force Base Airman 2C John Daniels identified Steele as the man who shot him in the face.

The airman was found in Mrs. McGowan's home with the bodies of the woman and her son, but said he knew nothing about the fatal shooting.

Steele was arrested in New Jersey Tuesday after he attempted to make a charge purchase in a Sears, Roebuck store.

An alert clerk, noting the slabo appearance of Steele, and the El Paso credit card he was using gained his attention is a security officer.

Accused Murderer Returned

Robert P. Steele, confessed killer of Erika McGowan and her son, Peter Fortin, arrived in Roswell last night by plane in the custody of Sheriff W. E. Smith.

Smith flew to Hackensack, New Jersey Wednesday to take charge of the prisoner. Steele waived extradition after his arrest at Paramus, New Jersey, Tuesday.

He was booked on rights to counsel early today by District Attorney Pat Hannagan and a Peace Justice J. P. Jones.

Later, District Judge George L. Reese appointed Roswell attorneys Ross Malone and Paul Stead to act as Steele's defense counsel.

Steele is being held in the Chaves County jail without bond. Steele's preliminary hearing was expected to be held this afternoon. However, Malone and Stead indicated late this morning that the hearing would probably be set for next week.

Steele, in his flight, from Roswell after the dual murder on Oct. 3, traveled a circuitous route to reach New Jersey. He said he left Roswell and went to Waldenburg, Colo., and Denver. Then he traveled to North Platte, Neb., and to Chicago, Ill.

Steele entered a department store in Paramus, New Jersey, Tuesday. Clerks told security officer, Edward Cannon about the unshaven, shabbily dressed customer who had made a credit purchase with a card from Treva.

As Cannon recognized the name and alerted the police, Steele slipped out of the store, backed a ride to another part of town, and was attempting to enter another department store when a patrolman apprehended the unarmed man.

Airman 2C John Daniels of Walker Air Force Base, also found in Mrs. McGowan's home with the bodies of the woman and her son, has identified Steele as the man who shot him.

Somber, Gaunt Steele Hustled From Airport

A few spectators watched as a solemn, gaunt Robert P. Steele, 29, alighted from a Silver Airlines plane Thursday night. A jacket, carried in front of him, hid his handcuffed hands. Steele, led by Sheriff W. E. Smith, was quickly surrounded by sheriff's deputies and hustled to a car parked in front of the airport.

Until recently Steele, employed by the Federal Electric Company of Paramus, New Jersey, was an electrical part supply man on the local missile sites. He was fired on September 8.

Then, on the night of Oct. 2, Steele helped celebrate the promotion of Airman 1-C John Daniels of WAFB. He left the Rockwell Lounge in company with Daniels and Mrs. McGowan. He shot the woman and her son and Daniels several hours later.

Steele told Sheriff Smith he owned the murder weapon for several years. The pistol has never been found and Steele denies knowing what became of it. He has still given no reason for the triple shooting.

Smith said Steele was calm and cooperative on the trip from New Jersey.

Commenting on the flight to Roswell, Sheriff Smith said Steele was "very cooperative all the way home."

Steele was born in Iowa, Idaho on April 20, 1935. According to Smith, he is married, has two children, and is separated.

Smith said that Steele has no previous record with the police.

Slayer of Mother, Child, Convicted

Robert P. Steele, confessed killer of Erikka McGowan and her son, Peter Martin, entered a plea of guilty to second degree murder on two counts Thursday morning, and was sentenced to 10 to 30 years in the state penitentiary on both counts.

After pronouncing sentence, District Judge Kermit Nash said, "I have read the pre-trial report and have purposely kept myself clear of any of the facts of this case until I arrived here (Roswell) this morning. I am convinced it would serve no purpose to make you (Steele) serve both sentences consecutively."

Judge Nash ordered both sentences to run concurrently, allowing Steele a possible parole in three years and four months.

The sentence was the same asked for by Steele's attorney Ross Malone, speaking for the defendant before sentence was passed, said he realized that he could not ask for clemency for Steele, considering the seriousness of the crime.

Malone, and his law partner, H. L. Hensley, told Judge Nash they had checked Steele's background and found him a responsible citizen. When Judge Nash asked why the murders happened, Malone said they were the result of "three people, all friends, having a sociable evening." He said the three drank between one and one and a half fifths of brandy. He said Steele claims he did not remember what happened at the time of the shooting. Malone reported Steele as saying, "I shot my two best friends and I don't even know why."

Malone told Judge Nash a psychiatrist who examined Steele said he could have had amnesia

as he claimed.

Both attorneys pointed out that friends of the murdered woman had rallied to Steele's side and offered to help. Malone said A-2 John Daniels, wounded in the shooting, which took place on Oct. 3, 1963, had offered to help.

Throughout the hearing, Steele, dressed mostly in a dark grey sport coat and slacks, stood silent before the bench, face pale and drawn.

The sister of Erikka McGowan

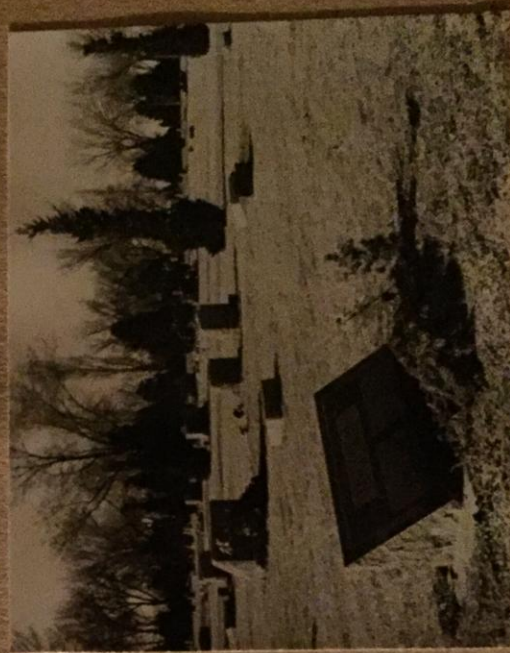
sat in the courtroom crying, as Steele was brought into the room. When he looked at her she clasped her hands together in the classical "vow" sign and smiled.

After the court was recessed, news reporters asked permission to speak with Steele to get his comment on the sentence handed down. Reporters have been attempting to speak with the defendant since he was returned to Roswell to stand trial, without success.


District Attorney Pat Hanagan and Attorney Ross Malone have both refused to allow anyone to speak with Steele because of an expressed fear of pre-trial publicity.

After sentencing, Sheriff W.E. Smith referred reporters to Hanagan, who said reporters would have to talk with Steele's attorney.

In refusing reporters permission to speak with Steele, Malone said, "I don't believe it would be advisable at this time." Malone said he believed any statement Steele would make would influence the parole board when he was eligible for release from Santa Fe. "If he says he thinks he got a light sentence, the parole board might take that into consideration."

HOMAGE TO CAPTAIN SYMPHONIC OVERTURE
Thomas Lewis

I believe that people are always attracted by the unusual. Certainly to a newcomer to the Roswell area, the mountain west of us is probably the most outstanding eye-catcher. Since living in Roswell, I have had daily occasion to observe this masterpiece of nature in all its many moods, not without a great deal of awe and respect for the hand that created it. Thus, when I decided to write a piece of music to commemorate the fifth anniversary of the Roswell Symphony Orchestra, I thought of paying musical tribute to this lasting landmark as well.

My first (and probably most permanent) impression of Captain was the feeling of stark power which it seems to evoke. This I decided to make the central "theme" of the overture. Too, although it is usually clearly visible, I felt a definite aura of mystery, which, at a distance, surely belies a serene beauty that is often heightened by matchless sunrises and sunsets. To me, it has real personality — perhaps many. It can be cold, remote, yet so much that it seems without visible be-coming, notwithstanding the fact that it is the heart of the life or vegetation. I have tried to capture some of these feelings in the composition, which is built on traditional overture lines. Starting with an introduction which might suggest that the sleeping giant is awakening, the music accelerates to its full frenzy, portraying the power and drama of crags and crevices which one must surmount to reach a pinnacle which might be imagined as an altar to its creator. Here, in the middle of the overture, I have set down a chorale, in muted strings, in keeping with the almost religious contrast I feel to be present. This meditation gives way once again to the powerful, sometimes dissonant rhythms of the central theme, reaching, in the coda, for a summing up of sound in majestic proportion, reminding us of its lasting, immortal presence.

When asked about my reason for writing an obviously programmatic piece about a "mountain," I rather like to give the answer given by a famous mountain climber relating to his own motivation . . . 'Because it's there!'

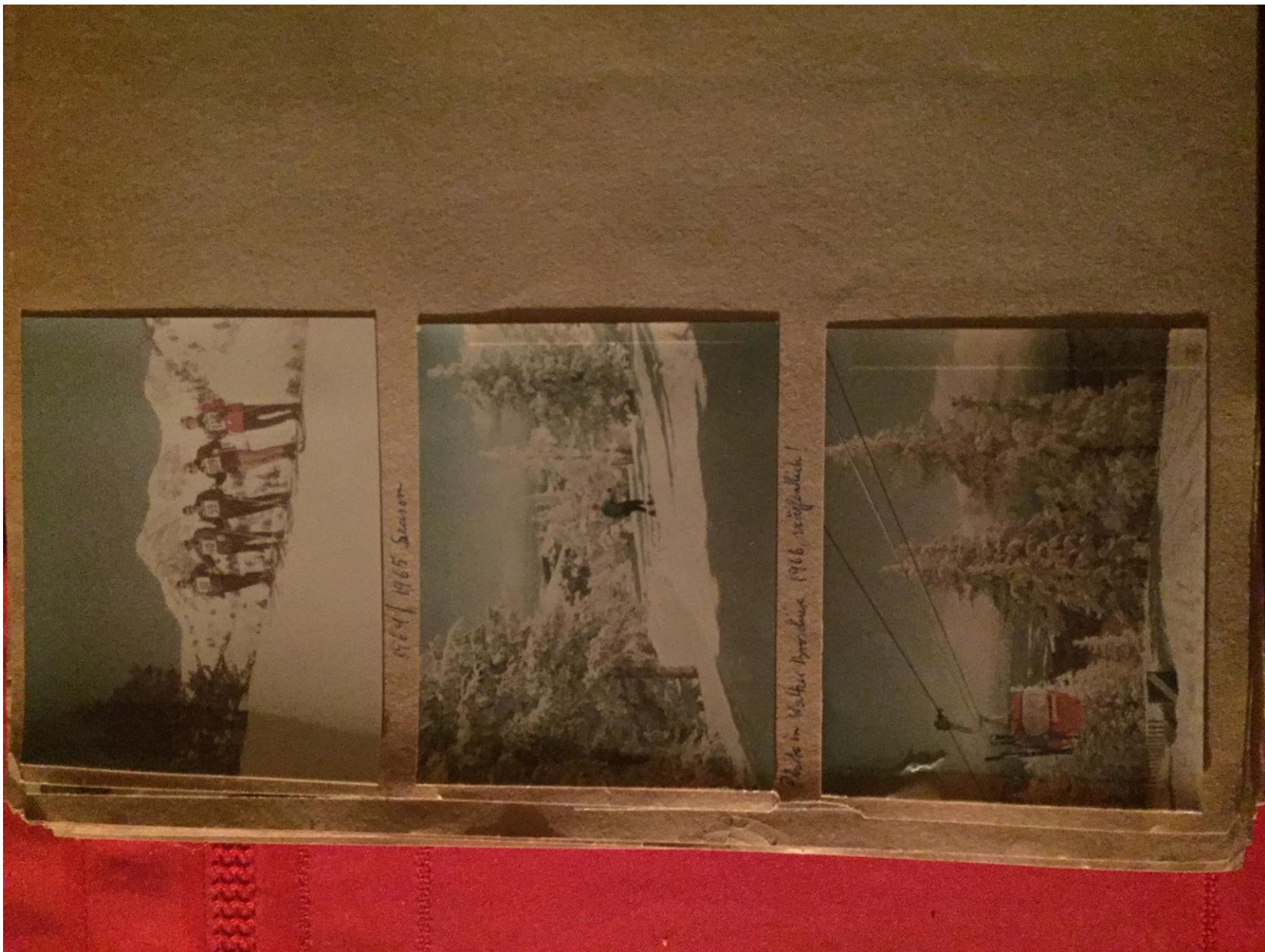

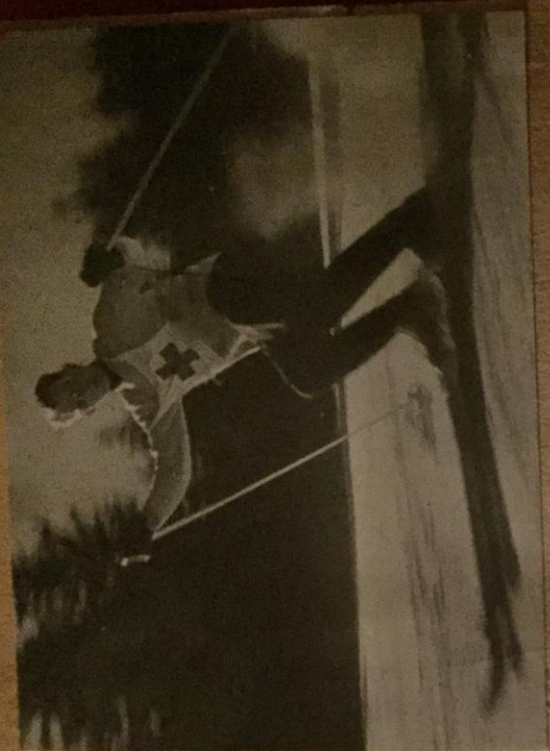

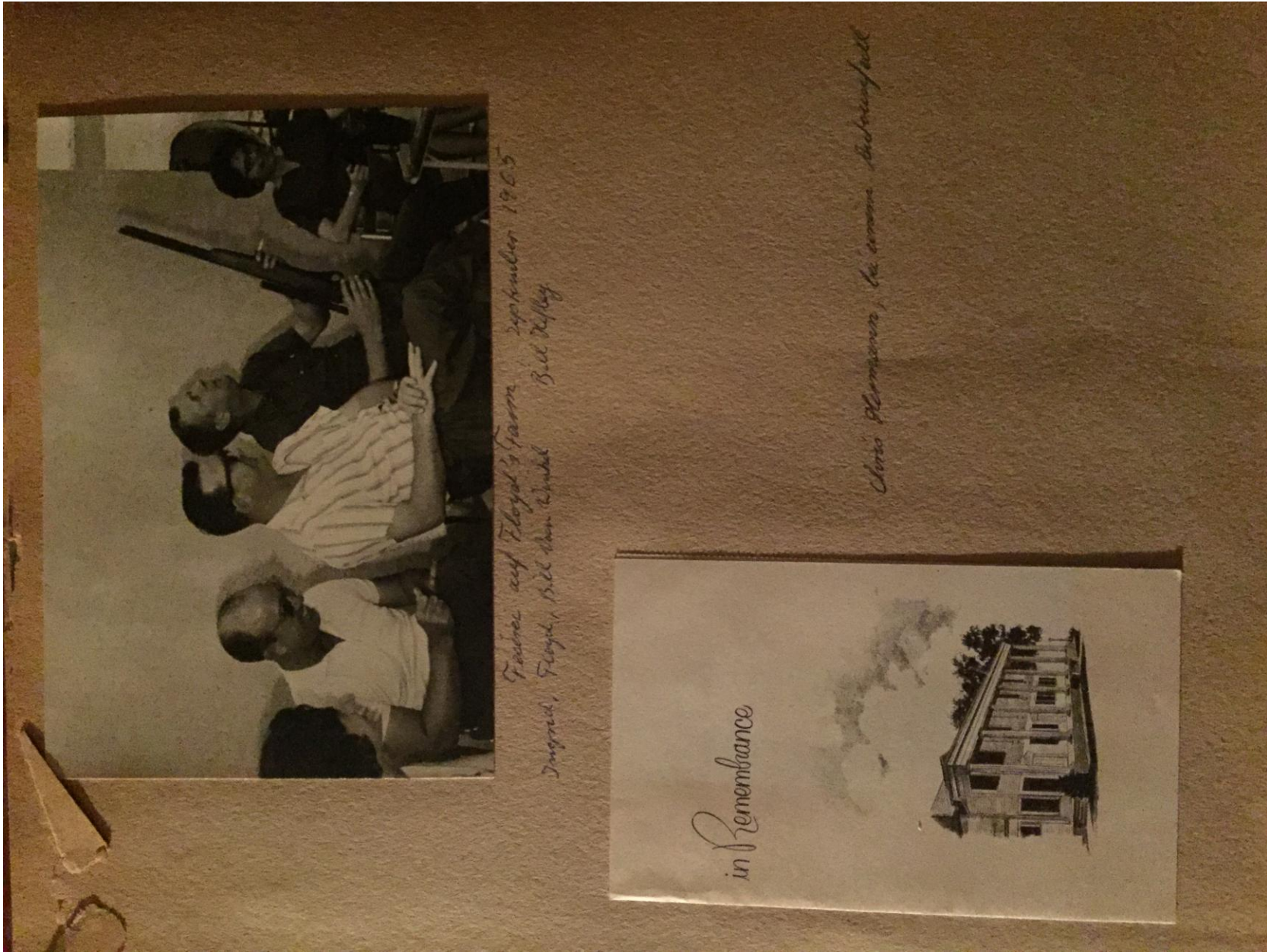
Safety, Slogans Mark Ski Week
