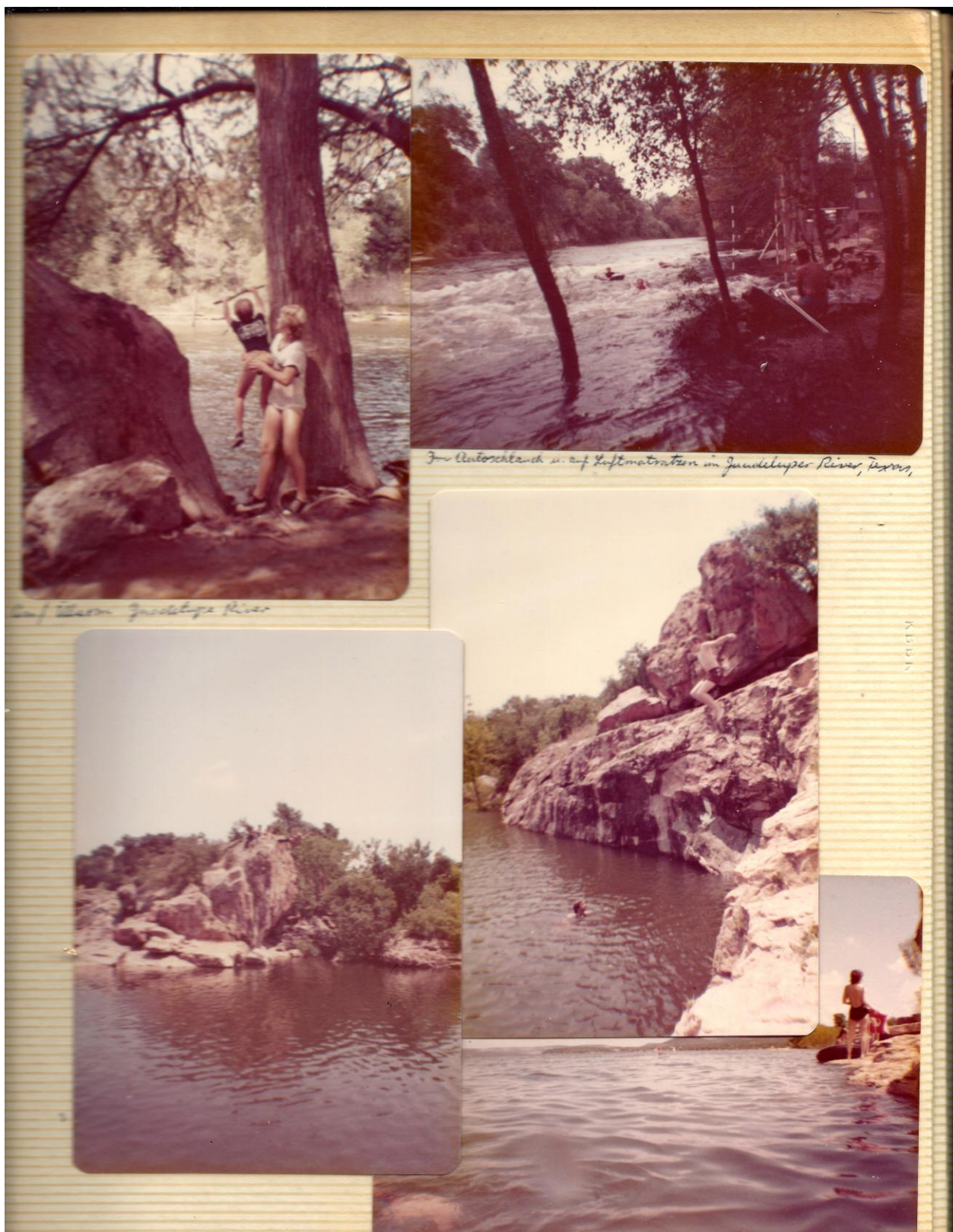

## *Base librarian slain*

Mrs. Emily Welty, base librarian here since Oct. 1964, was found slain in her home Tuesday.

She died of strangulation, according to autopsy reports conducted at Hyltin-Manor Funeral Home by a Dallas forensic pathologist.

Neighbors and friends of Mrs. Welty's said she was quiet and friendly and nursed a "sentimental attachment" to her plants, many of them planted by her parents, who have been dead for several years.

"She was a quiet, very congenial and trusting person who wouldn't be very wary of meeting strangers," said O. E. Hinkle, a neighbor from across the street. "If someone came and wanted to use her telephone, she'd probably think nothing of letting them in."

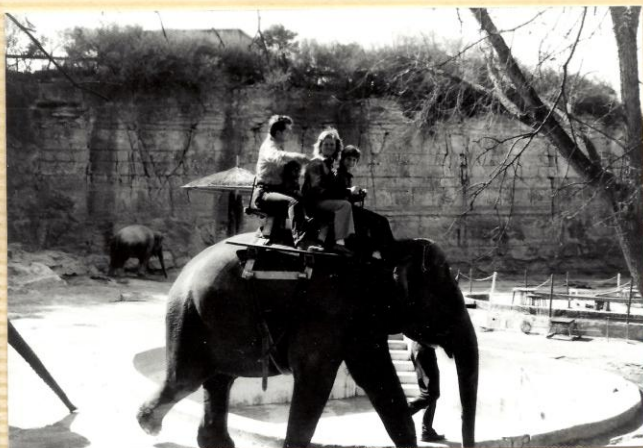
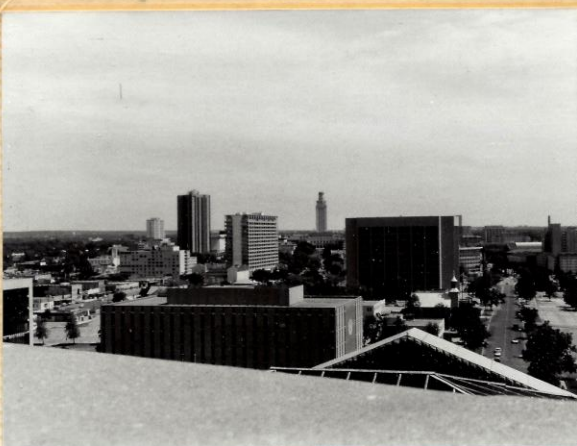

## Base Library starts new checkout system



**READY TO GIVE ASSISTANCE** to a customer is Mrs. Emily Welty, librarian here since 1965, who is working on book orders at her desk.

In effect at the base library now is a new book charge-out system which makes the process of checking out a book much more convenient for library patrons.

Rather than fill out a card each time they check out books, patrons will instead present a library card and I. D. card.

It took the library a year to process all books, which currently number 29,720, including 7,500 children's books.

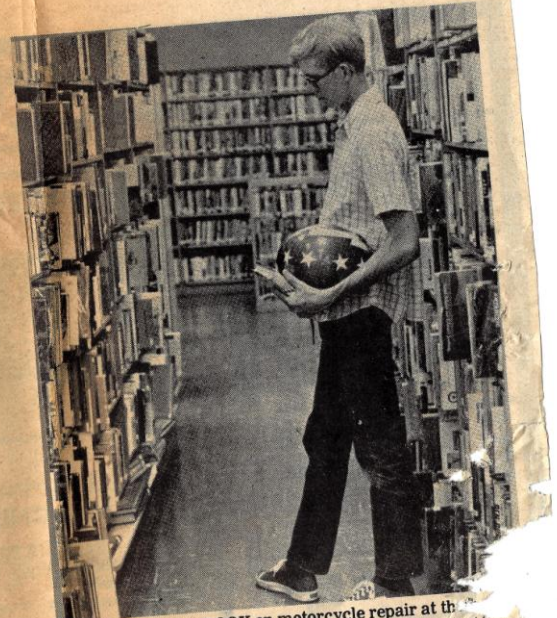
Mrs. Emily Welty, librarian here since 1965, urges all library patrons to register for machine charge-out cards. About 400 have already registered for them. Each military family will have one card to serve all its members.

Mrs. Welty noted that some of the most popular books these days are those on automotive repair and foreign languages, particularly Spanish.

More magazines and educational books are being added to the library's shelves because of the NCO Academy's imminent move to Bergstrom. The library presently handles 288 periodical subscriptions and 39 newspaper subscriptions. These figures include those received by offices on base.

The average number of books checked out during one day is 150. The figure occasionally hits 250. Months of the heaviest use of the library are April and October. Mrs. Welty accounted for this high use being due to college and work load increases.

Their goal of continuing better service to customers is clearly evident in the day to day operations of Bergstrom's library.

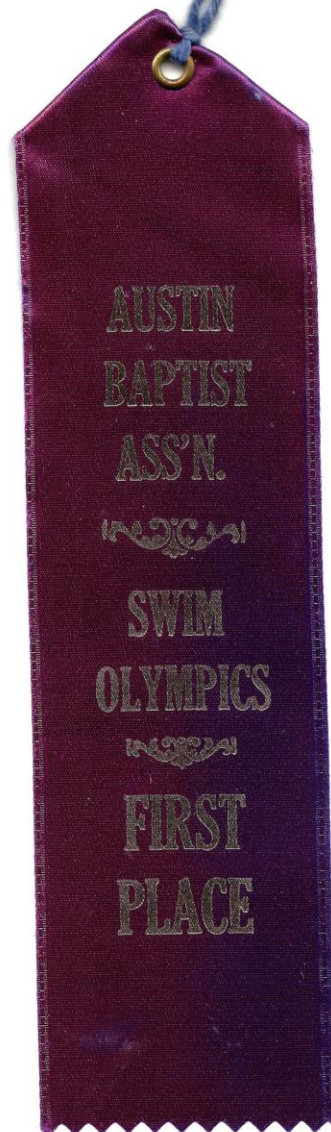


**LOOKING FOR A BOOK** on motorcycle repair at the library is one of the approximately 150 patrons using the library each day.
