
#### Introduction




From May 1974 to December 1977, the family lived at 2319 Village Circle Austin Texas. Hans was stationed at Burgstrom AFB near Austin Texas.


In the Summer of 1976, the family visited Germany. During this trip they visited Herford and also visited Renate now living near Belgium.
